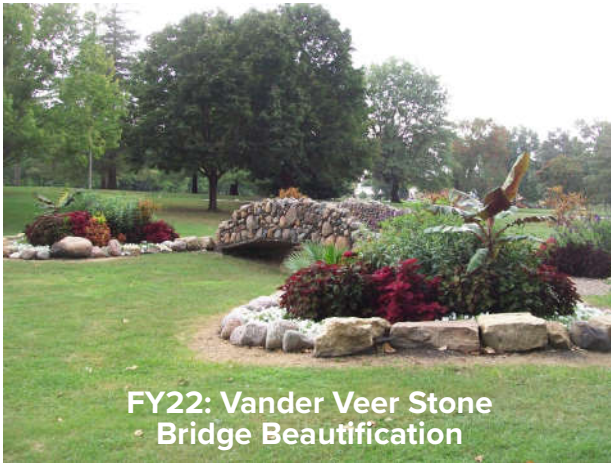

Each year Davenport Parks and Recreation is awarded \$350,000 in Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) funding for the Park Development Program. This funding is used for projects, equipment, and special requests not typically covered by general funds or the operating budget.

Over the years this program has replaced playgrounds, enhanced park amenities, updated facilities, purchased equipment, created new program opportunities, and more.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

1. In collaboration with the Horticulture and Environmental Education Programmer, staff will develop educational and interpretive signs.
- Vander Veer Botanical Park: Historical timeline of park including photos, Bee Hive sign and Lagoon animal facts and reminders sign, Sun Dial, Enabling Garden Information. One copy of each type of sign.
- Fejervary Learning Center: History of space, Education about Naturalization area in center. One copy of each type of sign.
- Multiple Parks: Educational signage about No Mow and Naturalization efforts (Suggested parks: Eastern Ave, Prairie Heights, Slattery, Duck Creek, Credit Island and Garfield). Initially planning to have 20 signs made.
2. Story walks are a fun, educational activity that places the pages from a children's story along a trail/park walkway in a community for children of all levels to enjoy the outdoors and read a book with their family and friends. In collaboration with the Davenport Public Library, 18 total permanent sign frames along walkways with 2 pages of a children's story book in each frame so families can walk along and read the story together. Story book pages would be changed out every 4-6 months throughout the year by library staff. Park locations include: Jersey Farms Park, Van Buren Park, Lafayette Park.

JUSTIFICATION

1. The purpose of this project is to improve communication with community members and park users and address common questions staff receive with educational/informational signage beyond rules and regulations. The goal is to not only explain and educate park users about the park itself, but offer information they can use in their own yards as well.
2. A Storybook Trail helps build children's interest in reading while encouraging healthy outdoor physical fitness. This collaboration has a two-fold purpose 1) extending literacy outreach into areas that have been identified as library deserts and 2) creating positive recreation opportunities in park spaces. The total cost of this project is approximately \$18,000. The goal is to jointly fund between Davenport Public Library and Davenport Parks and Recreation (DPR's match is \$9,000). Davenport Public Library is seeking funding for their part.

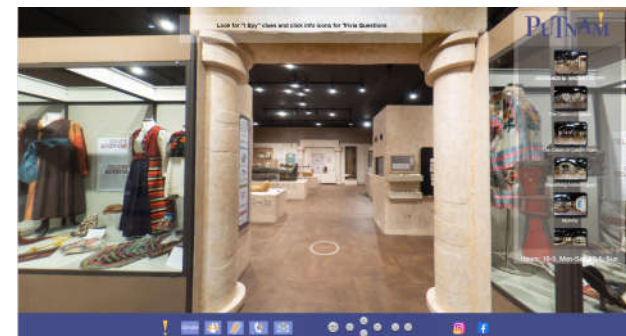

JUSTIFICATION

The purpose of this project is to improve customer experiences for those interested in reserving indoor spaces in Davenport while reducing staff demand on site for tours. Interactive virtual tours hosted online will allow customers to preview spaces and learn more about each space prior to checking availability. These virtual tours will expand department marketing efforts for these spaces that are sources of revenue while streamlining the customer experience.

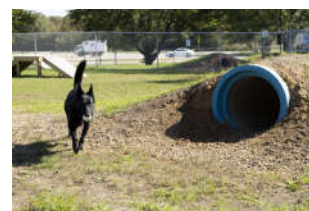

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Establish a permanent Education Room within the Vander Veer Conservatory—in which different resources can be displayed and allow for rotational/seasonal changes in exhibits.

Retrofit a museum-esque display and learning area inside the old park retail store.

Updating space to be more dynamic, welcoming, and usable in all conditions—including installation of external awning, display cases, TV/ AV system for passive info and classroom usage, informational signage (in collaboration with Community Outreach and Experience Manager), and a "play space" where interactive connections may be made and nature based books can be housed and read by visitors.

Additionally, expanding permanent display areas within the Fejervary Learning Center to further utilize resources, such as loaned taxidermy, making them more accessible to the public.

JUSTIFICATION

To utilize the previous park retail store space currently unused inside the Conservatory and create a space interactive and passive learning.

This project supports the Department's goal of improving and expanding the City's Environmental and Horticulture Education program to have a well-equipped and recognizable "home-base", as well as an area to house and use resources currently under utilized, spread throughout different parks and storage.

Vander Veer Botanical Park and Conservatory attracts approximately 10,000 annual visitors. This project will create a space for them to spend more time within the conservatory and provide the opportunity to have educational and hands-on experiences, encouraging repeat visits and interest in programming offered.

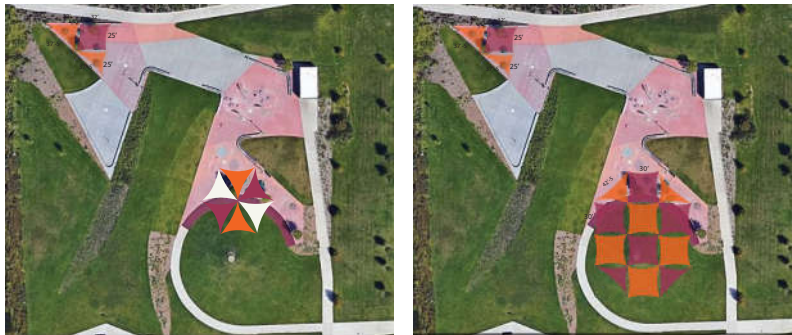

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Install shade structures at the Centennial Park spray park and the Red Hawk Bocce Ball courts.

JUSTIFICATION

The umbrellas currently used at the spray park are raised and lowered each day during the spray park season. This adds extra wear and tear to them. This project proposes shade structures that can be installed prior to the spray park season that would stay in place throughout the summer effectively limiting wear and tear over time and extending the life of the structures. There is no shade at the Red Hawk Bocce courts.

A marley dance floor was purchased approx 12 years ago. The floor needs replaced. Dance cannot occur on the current hardwood stage floor. This floor is rolled out by a team of two and taped down for every dance program event and also for many rentals throughout the year.

Due to use, it is torn and starting to pull up on the ends, making it difficult to use for dance. Overtime the taping down and pulling up wears on a floor as well. Typical lifespan is 10-12 years. In order to continue dance programs and rentals, floor needs replaced.

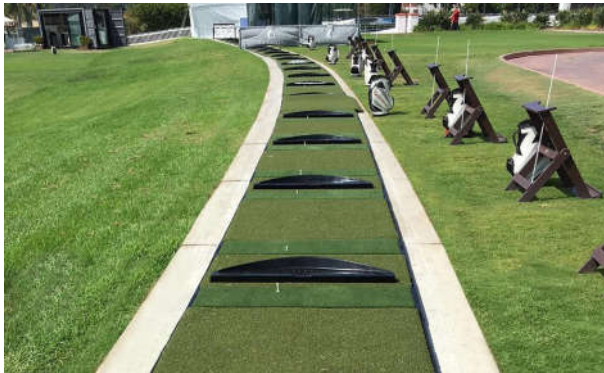

Purchase of range ball equipment - automated range ball machine for Indoor Golf Range at The River's Edge (\$6,000) and range ball washers (\$12,000) for each golf course.

Equipment Ordered: Summer 2023

JUSTIFICATION

During the winter months, an indoor driving range is set up on the turf at The River's Edge. This provides golfers with a space to continue practicing and is a source of revenue during quieter turf times. An automated range ball machine is customer friendly while being an improved efficiency for staff. The current range ball washer equipment is aging. New ball washers would provide efficient handling and cleaning of range balls for golfers.

Improved range conditions and equipment leads to increased revenue opportunities and usage.

Notable updates from Staff

Park Operations

- ARPA projects are continuing to progress – Harbor Road Park obstacle course has been installed; Lafayette Park playground has been installed; Whalen Park playground has been delivered and is pending installation; staff have removed fencing from Cork Hill Park and Van Buren Park tennis courts as well as the surface at Van Buren Park in preparation for installation of the multi-sport courts; Emeis Park obstacle course playground has been ordered; Cork Hill splash pad has been ordered; and work continues on design of the Dohse splash pad area.
- Other CIP project updates include: Vander Veer greenhouse roof, which is currently being placed; Dillon fountain electrical upgrades work was awarded; Whalen Park walking path is in the City's E-plan review; Credit Island Park nature playground will be in E-plan review soon; and the LeClaire House and Fejervary Cougar House roof replacements projects will be in contract for architect design soon.
- Davenport West High School welding class finished making "Frosty, The Snowman" statue. Staff installed it at the Fejervary Learning Center for the Holiday Lights display. As always, West High School students did great work.
- The lack of snow has allowed staff to work on tree branch trimming and other outdoor projects.

Recreation

- The next AmeriCorps Cycle Grant for 2023-2026 was finalized for submission on January 4, 2023. The grant totaled \$493,042 of federal funds.
- On Friday, December 2 staff assisted *The Arc of the Quad City Area* host their annual holiday party. DPR staff were "in charge" of decorating and interacting with guests throughout the evening. There were 90 participants and volunteers in attendance at the CASI building. Next year, the department will host this dance with assistance from ARC at the Mississippi Valley Fairgrounds - Starlite Ballroom.
- Volleyball has a record number of teams in the league with 34 teams - up from 19 last year.
- The Department is an "official outpost" for Letters to the North Pole. Children can write letters and expect a response back from one of Santa's helpers at the North Pole. This new program was launched November 26 and is running until December 15. Responses

will be mailed December 19. Mailbox outpost locations for drop off are at the Fejervary Learning Center, The River's Edge, and Vander Veer Conservatory.

Revenue Facilities

- The River's Edge hosted the annual Dance Marathon, a fund raising event, on Dec 3.
- Duck Creek Golf will remain open for play when 50 degree weather is forecasted.
- Duck Creek and Emeis pro-shops are still open for gift-cards and golf merchandise sales.
- Golf staff are currently completing tree work, irrigation repairs, building maintenance, and leaf blowing on greens for Duck Creek golf play.
- Emeis Bunker renovations have made excellent progress this November and December, with 3 completed. Another 14 have been excavated - approximately ½ completed.

Top Staff Challenges

Park Operations

- We will begin recruiting efforts for the 2023 season after the New Year. The department will take any help in spreading the word that Davenport Parks and Recreation is a great place to work.

Recreation

- Staffing, especially referees, continue to be a challenge. Summer recruitment will kick off in January when collage-aged students are still in town on their holiday break.

Revenue Facilities

- Staffing challenges continue.
