ORDINANCE NO. **2025-430**

AN ORDINANCE FOR CASE ORD25-01 BEING THE REQUEST OF ST. AMBROSE UNIVERSITY TO AMEND THE CAMPUS LAND USE PLAN, BOUNDED BY HARRISON STREET, WEST LOCUST STREET, BROWN STREET, AND LOMBARD STREET.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAVENPORT, IOWA:

Section 1. The following described unit of Scott County, Iowa real estate is hereby subject to the adopted land use plan in Case ORD25-01. The property has the following legal description:

Part of the South Half of Section 23, Township 78 North, Range 3 East of the 5th P.M. being more particularly described as follows:

Real property located within the boundaries of Harrison Street, West Locust Street, Brown Street, and Lombard Street. Said property contains 53.2 acres, more or less.

Section 2. That the following findings and conditions are hereby imposed upon said ordinance:

Findings

1. The land use plan is consistent with the Davenport +2035 Future Land Use Plan, which identifies the property as Civic and Institutional.
2. The land use plan amendment is appropriate for an 'Educational Facility-University or College'.
3. The proposed land use plan is generally consistent with the established institutional character of the area; however, the expanded parking west of Gaines Street will necessitate the removal of an existing residential neighborhood.
4. The land use plan is consistent with the principal uses permitted within the IC Institutional Campus District.
5. The proposed zoning map amendment promotes the public health, safety, and welfare of the City.
6. The proposed Campus Land Use Plan does not create any nonconformities.

Conditions

1. The fencing plan shall replicate the brick pillars and black ornamental fencing currently in place along Harrison Street and shall incorporate robust landscaping to delineate the campus from adjoining neighborhoods.
2. No net loss of off-street parking spaces shall occur as a result of development unless supported by documentation demonstrating a reduction in parking demand.

Section 3. At its August 19, 2025 meeting, the City Plan and Zoning Commission voted to forward Case ORD25-01 to the City Council with a recommendation for approval subject to the listed findings and conditions.

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any of the provisions of this ordinance are for any reason illegal or void, then the lawful provisions of this ordinance, which are separable from said unlawful provisions shall be and remain in full force and effect, the same as if the ordinance contained no illegal or void provisions.

REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in full force and effective after its final passage and publication as by law provided.

The Scott County Engineer's Office completed a review of the area on East 90th Street in the vicinity of the Bettendorf Soccer Complex and determined that parking should be restricted along East 90th Street east of Scott Park Road for 1,500 feet and west of Scott Park Road for 400 feet. They recommend restricting parking on the road shoulders around the intersection with Scott Park Road based on:

- Parked vehicles creating sight distance obstructions that hinder safe turn movements.
- Insufficient shoulder width for car doors to not swing into the travel way.
- Parked vehicles obstructing the driver's view of traffic signs.
- Overall congestion during soccer games.
- Children crossing the high-speed highway.

Resolution approving changes to the existing Extreme DREAM Program. [Wards 1, 3, 4, & 5]

Recommendation:

Adopt the Resolution.

Background:

In the spring of 2023, the City launched the Extreme DREAM program in the Gaines Street Corridor neighborhood to address abandoned housing. The program provides up to \$100,000 per project in funding from the City's Heritage Fund to entities who acquire abandoned houses and then rehab and sell (to a homeowner) the completed home. With a budget of \$2.1M, a total of 6 abandoned house projects have been completed or are underway.

From staff analysis, it appears that there are several reasons why the majority of eligible properties in the existing neighborhood have not come forward for this assistance. The condition of some of the houses is past the point where even \$100k in grant/forgivable loan is sufficient to encourage rehabilitation. In other cases, existing owners are either unwilling to sell or buyers and sellers have not been able to agree on a purchase price. As such, what is proposed is to broaden the use of the funding in a couple of ways to allow more flexibility to address abandoned housing in the central city area. To perhaps reflect this program expansion, it is suggested that the program could be marketed as "Building DREAM".

First, the current approach would still be allowed, but the eligible area would be enlarged from the Gaines Street Corridor to the recently enlarged regular DREAM area which includes most of Davenport's central city. This enlarged area will make the vast majority of abandoned houses eligible for the program.

Second, a "new build" approach would be added wherein the City could acquire properties with abandoned houses that are too far gone, demolish the house, and build a new one on the *same property*. The house would be sold to a homeowner and, because of the source of funding, there would be NO income restrictions on the home-buying household. As the developer, the City would hire a general contractor to build the new house. Proceeds from the sale would stay in the fund for future Building DREAM projects. Staff anticipates being more proactive and strategic in acquiring abandoned houses that might meet these criteria.

If approved, staff will develop implementation and marketing components and other program details. Below are some general highlights:

- Project funding for abandoned house rehabs would continue to be committed to qualifying applications on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Two City-led new construction projects are proposed where two abandoned houses owned by the City (823 and 1006 Warren Street) were recently demolished. These are

in the current Gaines Street Corridor area and were deemed too far gone, even with the existing Extreme DREAM assistance. Future new construction projects would be contingent upon the pace of rehab applications, funding availability, and Council direction on real estate strategy.

- There is roughly \$1.4M remaining in the budget for Extreme DREAM. At this point, no additional funding would be needed. However, it is anticipated that this be revisited in the next 6-12 months in the event that these dollars are quickly committed.

WHEREAS, while \$2.1M was budgeted for Extreme DREAM, roughly \$1.4M still remains and can continue to be used for these proposed changes which is suggested to be called "Building DREAM".

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Davenport, Iowa that changes to the existing Extreme DREAM Program are hereby approved.

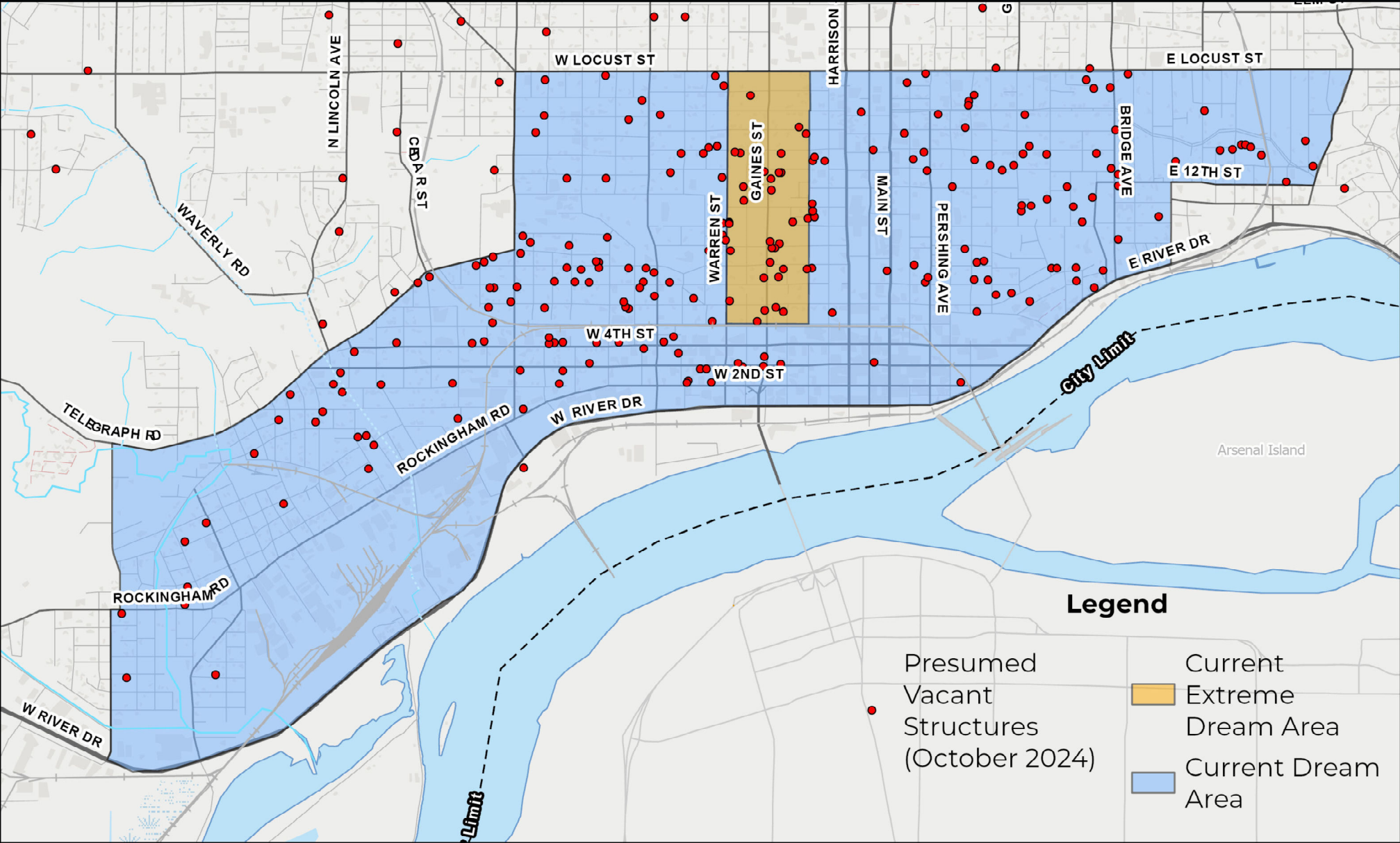

Recommendation:

Adopt the Resolution.

Background:

The Davenport Fire Department's Hazardous Materials Team serves Davenport, as well as Scott County, Clinton County, and Jackson County. The Davenport Fire Department has mutual aid agreements with several agencies within Iowa and Illinois including the Rock Island Arsenal Army installation. In addition, the Davenport Hazardous Materials Team is part of the Iowa Hazardous Materials Taskforce and the Iowa Weapons of Mass Destruction Strike Force. With these partnerships, personnel and equipment may be deployed throughout the state of Iowa. The team must have the capability to respond to hazardous materials incidents at any time and must be able to transport required technology, mitigation supplies, and personal protective equipment for responders to the incident.

The proposed vehicle is a forty-foot straight truck with a tandem axle which will allow up to six personnel to respond to hazardous materials events. Once on scene, the HazMat response vehicle is used for research, lighting, weather monitoring, donning protective equipment, incident command, and rehabilitation of responders.

Many efforts have been made in recent years to pursue federal funding or grant support for this purchase without success. The department can no longer afford to wait as lead times for vehicles are being quoted up to three years. The current vehicle is approaching 30 years old and is showing signs of its age, including stress fractures throughout the frame. These deficiencies are resulting in increased maintenance expenses and lack of reliability despite the Davenport Fire Department's efforts to repair the vehicle.

Procurement of a replacement HazMat response vehicle to support Davenport Fire Department's Hazardous Materials Team will increase personnel safety, provide a dependable, NFPA-compliant vehicle with lower maintenance costs, and allow continuity of operations and response capability. The total cost is estimated around \$1,800,000. This resolution will authorize the vehicle order. Payment will not be due until delivery. The FY 2028 budget will include general obligation bonds to fund this purchase.

RE: FY 2025 Inter-fund Transfers

GENERAL OVERVIEW

The City of Davenport budgets numerous transfers through the annual budget adoption process and regularly and routinely completes transfers between funds in order to carry out the lawful and public purposes of a municipal government. Under Iowa Code, the City must approve a resolution formally approving any transfer of funds. The associated summary and explanations of this transfer document are provided below.

GENERAL FUND

Transfers In

In FY 2025, the General Fund received fund transfers from two funds. A budgeted transfer of \$275,000 from the City's Tax Increment Financing Fund (TIF), approved by Council on October 23, 2023, was completed to offset economic development-related personnel costs paid from the general fund. A budgeted annual transfer of \$52,500 was completed from the Riverfront Improvement Fund to subsidize the cost of ground maintenance.

Transfers Out

During FY 2025, four funds received transfers from the General Fund. The Capital Project Fund received \$8,428 to fund the Community Improvement and Support Program (CISP). The Risk Fund received \$900,000 to mitigate the increased costs of insurance, increased costs of outside counsel, and to improve the fund's net position. The Youth Sports Fund received a General Fund subsidy of \$109,719, of which \$79,719 was planned. A transfer of \$37,662 was made to the Fair Housing Fund for reconciliation. Various funds received General Fund subsidies that were unbudgeted, including the River's Edge Fund (\$253,000), Parking Fund (\$43,744), and Airport Fund (\$49,873). Staff continues to monitor underperforming enterprise funds and is implementing strategic adjustments to improve their financial performance.

In FY 2025, the RiverCenter/Adler Theater Fund received an unbudgeted subsidy of \$463,031 from the General Fund, in addition to \$905,000 from Hotel-Motel Tax revenues—of which \$655,000 had been previously budgeted as a planned subsidy. City staff are currently collaborating with VenuWorks, the management company for the RiverCenter and Adler Theater, to identify strategies for reducing ongoing financial losses. In the coming weeks, staff will present recommendations to the City Council aimed at mitigating future deficits at the facility.

GENERAL DEBT SERVICE FUND

Transfers In

The General Debt Service Fund received a statutory fund transfer from the Local Option Sales Tax Fund in the amount of \$14,150,027. By referendum, the Local Option Sales Tax Fund transfers 60% of its revenues to the General Debt Service Fund to provide property tax relief.

Transfers Out

During FY 2025, the RiverCenter Fund received a transfer from the General Debt Service Fund to fund the General Obligation Bond payment in the amount of \$97,803.

CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND

Transfers In

The Capital Projects Fund received fund transfers from six funds. The fund received \$4,094,761 from the Local Option Sales Tax Fund to pay for various projects, including a neighborhood street program, public safety vehicles, IT digital storage and equipment, and field renovations at Modern Woodmen Park. An additional \$1,600,000 was transferred from the Road Use Tax Fund for the high-volume street repair program. The fund received \$11,668,573 from the American Rescue Plan Act Fund to fund projects previously approved by the Council. The Public Safety Fund contributed \$500,145 to fund Public Safety equipment, including body cameras and tasers and Project Safe Neighborhood. The fund received \$363,535 from the Library Special Levy Fund towards the Main Library renovations. Also, as previously mentioned, the General Fund transferred \$8,428 to fund CISP.

MISCELLANEOUS FUNDS

The Hotel Motel Tax Fund also provided a planned budget subsidy of \$50,000 to the River's Edge Fund. A budgeted transfer of \$75,000 was completed from the Local Option Sales Tax Fund to the Riverfront Improvement Fund to complete various riverfront projects. The Risk Fund received \$71,460 from the Sewer Fund to fund the No Fault Sewer Backup Program.

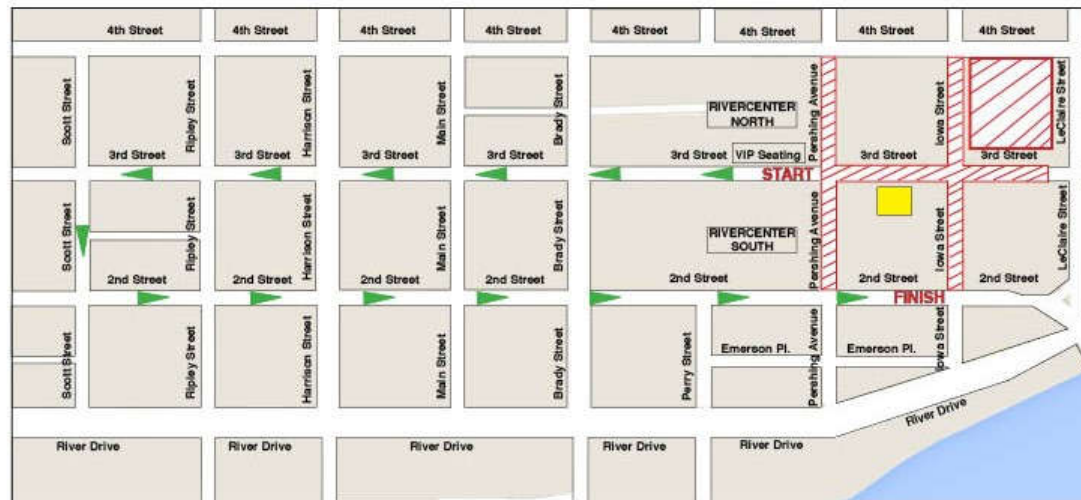
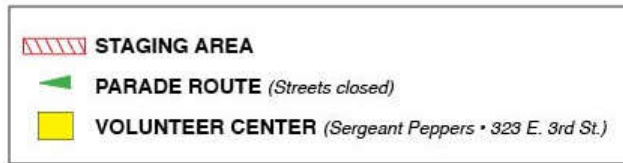

Motion approving Change Order #1 in the amount of \$81,845 to Bruce Builders, Inc of Eldridge, Iowa for the Davenport Police Station Water Mitigation project, CIP #23085. [Ward 3]

Recommendation:

Background:

The Police Station Water Mitigation project is replacing a portion of the facility's roof and courtyard walls to address water infiltration into the structure. On September 10th, the City Council approved the bid for this work for a total of \$777,932, well under budget. Change Order #1 adds scope to the project to further address known issues by including additional expansion joints, roofing and cladding work at the building perimeter. This dollar value was part of the sealed bid process but was accidentally left off of the original contract sent for City Council consideration. The inclusion of this change order into the contract still has the project under budget.
